Camphill Special School receives grant from Leon Levy Foundation

GLENMOORE, PA – January 4, 2008

Camphill Special School in Glenmoore, PA recently was awarded a grant from the Leon Levy Foundation. Camphill Special School, the only Waldorf school in the United States for children and youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities, offers age-appropriate educational and social opportunities by integrating academics and the arts with therapies and life skill and prevocational training.

The Leon Levy Foundation, founded in 2004, is a private, not-for-profit foundation formed from estate of Leon Levy, a legendary investor with a longstanding commitment to philanthropy. The Foundation's overarching goal is to continue the tradition of humanism characteristic of Mr. Levy.

The grant will fund Camphill Special School's educational and therapeutic programs for children in grades kindergarten through twelve, as well as its Transition Program for eighteen to twenty-one year olds. As part of the international Camphill Movement, the School seeks to engage all members of its life sharing community in meeting their own needs, as well as those of the community at large, to whatever extent

their abilities allow.
